

STUDENT'S SYMPTOMS DIAGNOSED ILLNESSES	STUDENT MAY RETURN TO SCHOOL WHEN
1. Fever greater than 100 (orally).	1. Temperature below 100 (orally) for a Minimum of 24 hours without use of Tylenol or other fever-reducing medication.
2. Rash or rash with fever—new or sudden onset.	2. Rash disappears. Written or phone consent from a M.D. to school nurse.
3. Vomiting/ Diarrhea	3. Symptom-free for 24 hours.
4. Strep throat diagnosed by a M.D.	4. Must have been on antibiotics for 24 hours and have written/phone consent from an M.D. to school nurse. If no antibiotic given, call the school nurse before sending child to school.
5. After an illness of two or more weeks, surgery, or other change in health status.	5. Written instructions from a M.D. and parent regarding medication or special health needs must be provided to the school nurse.
6. Skin lesions that are severe, weeping or pus filled.	6. Symptom-free or on medication for 24 hours or have a written or phone consent from doctor.
7. Eyes are red, inflamed, watery or have a discharge.	7. Symptom-free or on medication for 24 hours or have a written or phone consent from doctor.
8. Difficulty breathing or wheezing.	8. Symptom-free for 24 hours.
9. Complaints of severe pain.	9. Symptom-free for 24 hours.
10. Not able to fully participate in the activities.	10. Able to participate.
